It has often been observed that the world seems to be getting smaller. What that means is, because of improved technology, travel, and communication, it is very easy to hear news from around the world, around the clock. The recent disaster in Haiti is an excellent example. Almost immediately after the first tremors, news was being sent all over the world. While it was difficult for families and friends to learn the fate of specific individuals right away, we all at least knew about the great damage to property and of injuries and death of large numbers of people. This, of course, caused the world to spring into action to bring aid to the people.
